Your bags are packed, your car is loaded, your neighbor's picking up the mail, and you're all set for another winter-time vacation... or are you? Before you leave, here are a few more items that should go on your to-do list:

- Make sure your thermostat is set to 55 degrees. Any lower and you run the risk of coming home to frozen pipes.
- If possible, let warm water continuously drip, preferably from a faucet on an outside wall. This way, there's less of a chance of your pipes bursting.
- Leave a spare key with a trusted friend or neighbor and ask him/her to turn your faucets all the way on occasionally. Also show whoever's checking in where the main shut-off valve is located in case a pipe breaks.
- Open cabinet doors to allow heat to reach pipes
- Unplug your TV, computer and other **appliances** to protect them against power surges and conserve electricity. Save additional energy by switching off the lights or setting them on a timer.
